Weekly DMES Community COVID Testing

- Started last week and soft roll out of COVID testing on Staff
- Happy to report 100% vaccination of MacArthur staff
- 12:30-3:00pm Testing tomorrow (10/21) Every Thursday looking to have 30% of the DMES population
- We have a substitute nurse, and we absolutely intend on have Ms. Desmond back next year.

Literacy Program at DMES -- Ms. Angelo - Academic Interventionist, 2nd year in the roll

- Phonics K-2: **Really Great Reading** brought on from Literacy Task force.
 - Recognized a need for phonics across the district,
 - They went through 21 curricula, and chose the best for our system,
 - Advantage is they provide a lot of professional development and support for the teachers throughout the year
- Sept 30 was Family Literacy Night last month in case you want to watch the webinar (flyer)
- Grades 3-5: Words Their Way developed through UVA explicitly how to spell/decode words, beginning/ending sounds, and as it gets more intense

- Family Literacy Night: January 13 mark your calendars
- Ms. Hairston: Every child has Lexia for all students. Works on phonics, comprehension, and literacy
- We've done a lot of testing to get a better picture of the students and finding the interventions that
 are appropriate and are better informed when identifying who needs support and who is the best
 fit to support them.
- Ms. Hairston increased the number of interventionists from 2 to 3;
 - push your kids to use Lexia on their tablets
 - K-2 have Lexia, 3-5 have Lexia and IXL (for Math) so they can do work from home (if they haven't brought them home, families can pick them up from the school).
 - Other helpful resources:

How to get the most from Parent-Teacher Conferences

- DMES will have 100% conferences.
 - Ask your child's teacher how are they adjusting to school now that it's 100% in person:
 Social/Emotionally. Are they talking to friends? Who are their friends? Who are they eating lunch with? And are you seeing any changes at home? Tell the teachers.
 - If there is a resource/specific questions you would like the teacher to bring to/answer at the
 conference, let them know a couple of days before so they can be prepared to share those
 materials with you at the conference
 - Question: What kinds of conversations with our kids should we be having about all this testing?
 - Hairston, Pittman, Interventionist team, and your child's teacher have all the data on the reading level, and what tier they are in, etc to get a better picture of the children and how they compare nationally against other students.
