 - Registration closes Feb. 7 72 kids registered already!

- Six, simultaneous grade-level Bees (K-5)
 - Grades 3, 4 and 5 Winners compete on the Learning Stairs for champion title. Our champ will go to regionals in Fairfax County!
 - All invited to watch Champion Round will have some snacks!
- NEW THIS YEAR! 25 ACHS National English Honor Society Titans to volunteer (so parents can watch and enjoy!)
- ParentSquare message will go out shortly for 7 parents to volunteer as judges in grade Bees

Read-A-Thon Fundraiser

NEW FUNDRAISING MODEL THIS YEAR! GOAL: \$10K

- In previous years, donation requests focused in fall w/ Fall Appeal drive
 - Pro: Amount collected scoped what we could spend/accomplish for the year
 - Con: Heavy, concentrated fundraising burden on community a challenge in post pandemic economic reality
 - '23-'24 Fall Appeal raised ~19K, of \$26.7K total revenue for the school year
 - We ultimately spent ~\$28.2K, or \$1500 more than we raised
 - '24-'25 Fall Appeal raised ~\$15.8K school year goal of ~\$30K (Thank You!!)
- Read-a-Thon goal is twofold:
 - Distribue revenue sources and community financial giving across events through the school year
 - Directly invest students in the effort to raise funds & support <u>their</u> fun activities,
 - Spring Dance around the corner! §





Read-A-Thon Fundraiser

Monday, February 24 - Monday, March 24

- Structured not to burden teacher/school staff (though teachers can view student progress)
- Students/Families Enlist Sponsors; Sponsors Pay Direct via Web Portal
 - Parents/caregivers will sign students up via web portal organized by classroom
 - Parents/caregivers log reading minutes during Read-a-Thon month
 - Students earn "RAT bucks" based on reward milestones
 - Ex: Parent sending texts, social media posts to gather sponsors, reaching reading minute targets
 - Students purchase prizes via portal w/ RAT bucks
 - from art supplies, key chains, small toys/fidgets/games all the way to jump rockets, microscope kits, tablet and an Xbox Your student can set a unique goal!
- \$10K total goal equates to *less than \$20 goal per student*





Read-A-Thon Fundraiser

Monday, February 24 - Monday, March 24

- \$10K total goal equates to *less than \$20 raised per student* if all students participate
- Hope this model will entice families to join Welcome feedback through process!
- Working w/ school admin to create custom prizes for top reading classes and/or individuals

Keep in Mind!

The school already asks that students read (or be read to) ~20 minutes a day. That's 100 minutes each school week or 400 minutes a month!

Enlist some family friends to donate & incentivize your student's already assigned reading time w/ prizes and the communal goal of supporting the Spring Dance!

Girls On The Run

Girls on the Run (GOTR) for Girls in Grades 3-5: We are thrilled to announce REGISTRATION IS OPEN FOR SPRING '25 GOTR program. Registration opens February 3 and closes February 23rd at 11:59 pm. The season runs March 3 until May 18, with practices on Mondays and Wednesdays immediately after school. We will share more info in future newsletters and on the grade-level Facebook pages. Space is limited (24 girls), so if necessary, we will run a lottery to confirm participants.

- Program Dates & Practices: The season starts Monday, March 3 and meets 2x a week (M/W) until the weekend of May 17/18, 2025, which is the weekend of the GOTR 5K. All participants are invited to run in the 5k on this final weekend. GOTR is for girls in Grades 3-5. Practices will be held Monday and Wednesday, immediately after school: 2:35 pm until 4:00 pm.
- **Cost:** GOTR makes it a priority to make the program affordable and accessible to all participants. The standard registration fee for the season is \$210 for 20 lessons (2x a week, 10 weeks). There are several financial assistance, discounts, and payment options available to eligible families, particularly any that qualify for free or reduced lunches, SNAP, TANF, WIC, or Medicaid.





What will International Heritage Night look like?






- The <u>Cafeteria</u> will host music, dances and activities for families to share their culture in an interactive way. There will be tables representing the countries that shape our MacArthur community

What will International Heritage Night look like?


- <u>Performances/Demonstrations</u> will be on the stage in the cafeteria. Examples:

Multiple families can host a table/country


































In what ways can you participate?
